



RI'S ACHIEVEMENTS



Back in 1983, very few studies had been done on what we now call homeschooling. But I was fascinated by the topic. Families willing to do things differently? Parents willing to risk their reputation and jail time to educate their children outside of institutional schools? Pedagogical practices that are more relaxing, natural, and consistent with what so many professional educators know are really good for helping children learn? A schooling practice that goes against the grain of 100 years venerating experts in education and government/public schooling hegemony? And parents who want to spend more time with their children? This had to be captivating!

I remember first mentioning homeschooling to my doctoral major professor. He asked, "But is that legal?" I was disturbed. For a scholar and educator who came into his own during the 1960s and 1970s, he should not have been worried about the norm and what is legal. He should have asked, "Is it good for children? Does it work better than institutional government public schooling? Why? Why not?"

The homeschooling movement then started to take off and rise like a healthy batch of homemade bread. As the population and enthusiasm grew, the number of studies on homeschooling began to pick up. It was such an intriguing topic that I founded the scholarly journal *Home School Researcher* in 1985. The studies began to multiply. Now NHERI can barely keep up with the myriad of studies being done in nations around the world.

It was evident by 1990 that an institute was needed to do basic research and publishing on homeschooling, serve as a clearinghouse of all homeschool studies, and disseminate the facts and statistics to scholars, the media, policymakers, parents, and the general public. Ergo, others and I founded the National Home Education Research Institute!

It has been a fast and wild ride at times. NHERI has published many primary studies, been interviewed by major media in sundry nations, provided expert witness numerous times in courts and legislatures, and presented research findings at uncounted professional meetings and homeschool conferences around the world.

Negative critics have attacked NHERI. Some say that NHERI has a bias. They are either ignorant or do not want to admit that all researchers, scholars, professors, think tanks, and institutes have a bias. Every scholar works from a set of fundamental beliefs and presuppositions about knowledge, reality, and what is of value. Some are critical theorists, socialists, statists, metaphysical naturalists, humanists, or proponents of other –isms.

On the other hand, as NHERI conducts and evaluates research and serves the public, we are confident in the time-tested standards that spring from the worldview of Christianity and the general tenets of liberty-honoring classical liberalism. Such values drive NHERI. They have made NHERI an internationally recognized source of expertise, soundness, reasonableness, and respect for parental dutires, responsibilities, and rights and families in the field of education.

Many financial donors, advisors, and encouragers have been a key part in pushing NHERI forward. I thank them all! They have spread the fascinating and positive news about homeschooling around the globe. Now NHERI – after 35 years of service – is strategically positioned to continue as the key voice on homeschooling facts, statistics, and freedom-loving perspectives for decades to come.
